Farmer paid the same to workers who worked the least as much as to the workers who worked the most


 Moral of the Parable: The Kingdom of Heaven is a reversal of how things operate on earth
 Yeshua is on His final journey to Jerusalem
 Going to celebrate

Passover, and to change the course of history




- > Going up Jerusalem at 2500'
- Jericho 900' bellow sea level
- > Aliyah = going up
- Mark 10:32 45 = Matthew 20:17 28


There are some differences between Mark and Matthew



- Yeshua tells His 12 Disciples for a 3rd time of His impending betrayal and death
- "The Son of Man" Yeshua is again connecting Daniel's Son of Man to Himself

Disciples do not seem to acknowledge what Christ told them was going to happen to Him





A MOTHER'S INTERVENTION

- We tend to filter things out that don't fit our preconceptions
- James' and John's mother asks Jesus for a favor
- She wants her sons to have the two highest ranks in the royal court when Christ becomes king of Israel

- "...and be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized for..."
- > Only after 800 A.D. do we find those words
- What does Jesus mean by drinking the cup?
- It is a cup of suffering and death, but His Disciples don't get it
 Jeremiah 25:15
 Ezekiel 23:32 – 33
 Isaiah 51:17

First-Century Ritual Purity

Jews would immerse before entering the Synagogue. At Qum'ran they immersed twice every day.




A CUP OF SUFFERING

- Disciples say they can drink from His cup
- Yeshua says it is not for Him to decide the places of honor in the Kingdom, that belongs to the Father
- To show the Disciples that it is wrong minded to concern themselves over status, He says not to be like gentile rulers
 A Kingdom leader must be a servant to others



WHAT IS SACRIFICE?



- Yeshua says to use Him as a role model
- Lutron = ransom
- Greek world: pay way out of bond servitude, pay to be released as prisoner of war
- Hebrew world: Temple tax, redemption of first born, property bought back from debt holder
 Asham sacrifice = Reparation offering



- Matthew doesn't answer every question we might ask about Yeshua's death and resurrection
- In our day, answers come mostly from our prayer reflection
- In Yeshua's day, such sacrifice was thought of as a requirement of the Law of Moses, personally performed
- Christ said a number of things about who He was and His purpose, in different contexts in the *P'shat* and the *Remez*
- Matthew expected his Jewish readers to put the pieces together

"Son of David, have pity on us!"

- The 2 blind men were beggars, not travelers
- Son of David not meant in a messianic way, but rather invoked Solomon
- "Lord open our eyes!" Meant literally because they didn't want to be blind any longer
- Little "L" lord = sir
- It seems that the healed men followed Yeshua to the Passover Festival in Jerusalem maybe going for the first time
